# Nurturing Growth in the Classroom and Beyond

t is vital that we support our teachers both in the classrooms and with their personal educational goals. Many of SouthSide's teachers have utilized programs to continue their education and obtain degrees in early childhood education. One program that has been transformative for our teachers is The T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Missouri Scholarship (Teacher Education And Compensation Helps), which is a scholarship and compensation opportunity for educators in licensed childcare programs. T.EA.C.H. MISSOURI is part of a nationwide effort to increase the quality of care in childcare programs through increased education, with 21 states offering the successful program. At SouthSide, over 16 teachers have furthered their education through T.E.A.C.H. Missouri or with the help of funding from Youth in Need to complete their CDA. We want to extend a very special thank you to Child Care Aware of Missouri and Youth in Need for helping our teachers fulfill their dreams!











Ifrah has been working at SouthSide since March 2021. She is a parent and

is working as a part-time teacher with all age groups. Ifrah started her CDA in the fall of 2022 and is in the final steps of completing it.



Katie has been working at SouthSide since March 2019, Katie

started working towards her bachelor's degree in early childhood education through the T.E.A.C.H. program in 2020 right before the pandemic started. Katie transitioned into a lead toddler teacher in 2022 and recently graduated with a bachelor's degree in early childhood education from Central Methodist University.



Emily has been working at SouthSide since June of

2014. Emily graduated in 2014 with a bachelor's degree in early childhood education. The T.E.A.C.H. program started a pilot program for individuals interested in receiving a master's certificate, and Emily was accepted. She will be graduating this December from the program. Emily is now the Program Director at SouthSide's Downtown location.



Loretha, our longest tenured teacher, has been working at

SouthSide since March 1999. She originally started as a 2-year-old co-teacher, then transitioned into a preschool co-teacher and then became a lead 2-year-old teacher. Loretha will be completing the T.E.A.C.H. program's teacher certification in May.

## Flourishing Minds

fter receiving generous multiyear funding from the St. Louis Mental Health Board, SouthSide launched our Flourishing Minds Program, an expanded early intervention support program for SouthSide's preschool children at all 3 sites. Addressing children's socio-emotional needs early in life is critical for future success in kindergarten and beyond. In order to provide more intensive, individualized support for a smaller caseload of children, two Early Intervention Specialists (EIS) were hired. Utilizing the Conscious Discipline Program, a trauma-informed comprehensive socialemotional curriculum, the EIS also assist preschool teachers with classroom integration and techniques.



#### First year highlights:

- Saw growth in emotional literacy and development, calming strategies, small group interventions, conflict resolution and problemsolving strategies.
- The EIS report that they were able to maintain and strengthen their relationship with teachers and support staff in the classroom setting.
- Preschool teachers spent less time intervening with students and had more time facilitating classroom instruction due to support from EIS.

# DRDP Outcomes: All Preschool Children

The Desired Results Developmental Program (DRDP) is an observation based system. Children are observed during everyday learning experiences and their educators collect notes, photos, videos, and samples of their work. Formal DRDP assessments are conducted three times per year.

The Ages & Stages Questionnaires: Social-Emotional (ASQ-SE) and The Ages & Stages Questionnaire (ASQ-3) are screening tools used to help set individual goals for the children and assist in supporting their development. They help measure progress, identify strengths, and uncover any areas of concern. The ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE are administered multiple times throughout the year and on an as-needed basis to measure progress.

y integrating music, movement, and interactive play, Stomp the World helps foster holistic development in preschoolers. Through rhythm and motion, children not only refine their fine and gross motor skills but also cultivate a deep sense of teamwork, communication, and self-expression. For the past year, Co-Founder and Assistant Director, Mr. Kevin Lee has worked with our students. The program has been beneficial for everyone:


